
HOMEWORK

Snacks & Break

If you wish, you may send a mid-morning healthy snack with your child. They will have an opportunity to eat their snack during a 15 minute break each morning. During our break, we go outside or on super rainy days, students participate in a number of movement activities in the classroom to give their busy brains a rest.



5TH GRADE CURRICULUM

During the first week of school, the class and I will create a list of agreements that will allow everyone to have a positive experience in the classroom. Once the list is finalized, students are expected to follow these classroom agreements. For the first several weeks of school, I will teach my expectations, routines, and procedures, and students will practice them as they settle into 5th grade.

When students follow class agreements/routines: ③

- ©-Bucks: Students earn Connolly-Bucks (our classroom currency) to put in their own classroom savings account or spend at the class store.
- Marbles: The class earns marbles to collect in a jar. Once the jar is full, we have a marble party where students vote on a fun activity to do to celebrate their success!
- Compliment Cards: As a student is complimented for positive behavior throughout the week, their card is upgraded to a new color. Once a student reaches the final yellow card, they earn bonus C-Bucks.

IF students do NOT follow class agreements/routines:

- ☐ First step: Verbal/Nonverbal warning or redirection
- ☐ Second step: Fine paid with Connolly Bucks
- ☐ Third step: Time out with response sheet & Parent/Guardian notified
- ☐ Fourth step: Conversation to problem solve with the family

If a student continues to have difficulty following the classroom agreements, I will reach out to the family so that together we can come up with a plan to help the student be most successful in the classroom.



HOMEWORK

Homework will be assigned most nights with no homework on weekends. The emphasis on homework is to help students practice and solidify concepts presented in class and to help prepare for the rigor and time and task management expected in middle school. Your child will also have a planner, which will be filled out each day with homework assignments and other classroom information. Students are expected to read at least 30 minutes each night and to record minutes read in the planner. Your 5th grader will be bringing their planner, their homework folder, and a charged Chromebook to and from school each day. Remember: Homework should never cause a sense of panic! If at any time you or your child are uncertain about an assignment, please call, email, or send a note. Did your child forget homework at school? Or out sick? No worries! All homework assignments are linked on my website (http://mrskellyconnolly.weebly.com) and can be printed from home.

Typical Weekly Homework includes:

- 1 or 2 math assignments
- 1 writing prompt assignment
- ✓ 1 state crossword assignment
- ✓ read for 30 minutes or more each night & log
- keep planner updated
- ✓ complete any unfinished classwork



5th grade Homework Expectations

- 1. Check to see that your name and date are on every sheet or piece of paper.
- 2. All homework should be completed in pencil unless other instructions are given.
- 3. Double-check to make sure you have followed all of the directions.
- 4. Make sure you have answered all of the questions and completed every assigned task.
- 5. Look to see that your sentences or answers are complete and make sense.
